



ENVIRONMENT-FRIENDLY DIVING



Leave in place any living form of the wall or seabed - also applies to shells, dead corals or stones.



Look closely at the animals but do not touch them.



They know how to get their own food, and they know what to eat. You can only do harm!



Be careful not to bump the walls with coral life forms and not to fin among the leaves of *Posidonia*.



Maintain your trim and keep your gear composed, for the seabed and for other divers.



Do not leave any traces, in water nor on the boat. Take back home any plastic packaging you have with you.



Caves are part of a very delicate environment and specific procedures and techniques are required. Are you a qualified Cavern or Cave Diver?!



Underwater photographers are welcome, but you are not justified in laying on the seabed for the shot!

SAFETY FIRST



NO DECO DIVE

We dive within the Non-Decompression Limit. Please monitor your computer to stay in the dive plan.

RESPECT YOUR OWN LIMIT

We conduct dives for different levels of experience and certification.

FOLLOW THE GUIDE

Listen to the briefing and follow him/her underwater: it will grant you great fun and safety!

FORMS

Before diving you will need to fill out the registration form, as well as the medical questionnaire, statement of understanding and privacy form.

EQUIPMENT

Make sure your equipment is functional and appropriate for the dive you are participating in.

PROCEDURES

It is your responsibility to listen to the instructions and directions given for the guided dive. Always make a slow ascent and the safety stop.

PREVENTION

Stay hydrated and do not use drugs or alcohol before diving. Do not smoke. Avoid efforts after immersion. Report to the crew any changes in your psycho-physical state.

EMERGENCIES

In case of an accident or emergency, it is your responsibility to assist another diver, within the limits of your training, qualification or physical condition. In any case, if you become aware of a problem, immediately alert the crew. Do not take a rescue action that puts yourself or other divers at risk.
